




COMMITTED TO LIVES OF EXCELLENCE

- Gamma Mu Tau was the first Fraternity established on GMI's campus
- 91st chapter of Delta Tau Delta
- Chartered as Epsilon lota chapter of Delta Tau Delta on March 23, 1963
- Winner of Hugh Shields Award 16 times
- More than 170,000 men have joined the national brotherhood of Delta Tau Delta since its founding.
- DTD has spread to nearly 200 campuses, with more than 130 active chapters and colonies of roughly 10,000 students.
